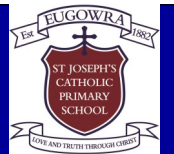

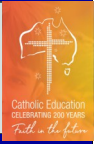

There are **10 Child Safe Standards** that we as a school and staff uphold to and provide evidence to the CEDB that these are being met.

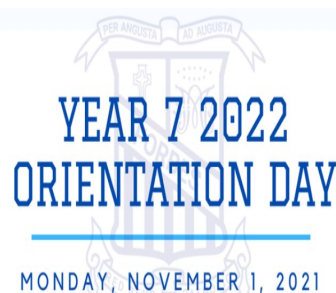
Each week we will explain 2 of these standards.

### 1. Child safety is embedded in organisational leadership, governance and culture.

Our school organisation is committed to child safety. This is demonstrated in strong leadership with a culture of transparency and accountability and prioritising the rights and safety of the children. All staff understand that keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility. We identify and mitigate risk, listen to children and parents and consider diverse needs and continual improvement.

### 2. Children participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.

Children are safer when we teach them about their rights to be heard, listened to and believed. Their age, development, maturity, understanding and abilities are taken into account. Our children are valued and taken seriously, involved in decision making and have their concerns responded to. Child safe organisations have strategies in place to all children are heard and encouraged to speak up if they feel unsafe.

### C. The Iroquois Longhouse

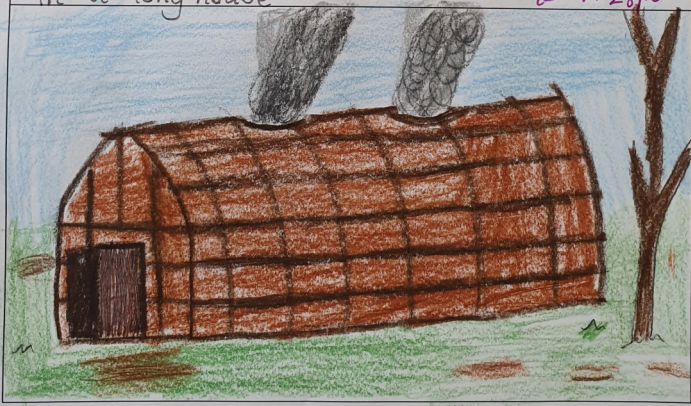

An Iroquois longhouse ranges from about 67 to 55 Meters. The longhouse is a symbol of their traditions and society. An Iroquois longhouse can hold up to 20 to 35 people. An Iroquois longhouse is a permanent home usually made from wood and bark. They had holes in the roof for smoke to escape. It lasted about 20 years until it began to break. There are 2 rooms in a longhouse. 28/10
